Facts at a glance:

- The earliest point at which an application can be made for a Registrar position is during Postgraduate Year 2 (PGY2) with entry for successful trainees in Postgraduate Year 3 (PGY3). At House Officer level, candidates must do 3 months in ED but 6 months is preferable (3 months of this training can be in Paed ED).
- In the 2015-2016 training year, 15 House Officers from the Auckland Region were promoted to Emergency Registrar positions (this includes House Officers who stepped up for the June-December period of 2015).
- There are approximately 61 Emergency Registrar positions in the Auckland Region.
- There are approximately 132 Emergency Consultants in NZ.

Training Programme Format:

- Provisional training year will consist of 12 months in ED.
- Advanced trainees will complete an additional 2.5 years in accredited ED runs and 12 months in non-ED runs, with a further 6 months optional in either ED or non-ED.
- Advanced training also has a compulsory paediatric component which runs parallel to, and not in addition to, the above time periods. A variety of other special interest disciplines can be incorporated within the training programme.
