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Re: Official Information Act request - Percentage coverage diabetic retinal screening

I refer to your Official Information Act request dated 10 February 2021 requesting the following information:

Can I please ask:

If measured or estimated, can I please ask for the percentage coverage for diabetic retinal screening (i.e., the proportion of people with diabetes who have had a retinal screen within the last two years, or other reporting period)?

Retinal screening coverage as at 30 September 2020

The following information includes:

Adults enrolled with a general practice within the Auckland DHB catchment and coded as
diabetic who have received a publically funded diabetic retinal screen by one the metro
Auckland DHBs diabetic retinal screening services in the previous two or three years.

Data caveats:

- Not all practice data is included in this report. Data was provided for 135 out of 147 general practices based in the Auckland DHB catchment.
- People who are not enrolled with a PHO are not included.
- People who live in metro Auckland but are enrolled with a PHO outside of metro Auckland are not included.
- Retinal screening undertaken by private specialists is not included.
- Retinal screening undertaken in a DHB outside metro Auckland is not included.
- Retinal screening undertaken overseas is not included.

COVID-19 has had an impact on retinal screening coverage across all DHBs. This impact is believed to be multifactorial with several contributing factors i.e. clinics closed during lockdown periods, reduced clinic capacity when clinics did reopen and also people with diabetes preferring to defer their retinal screen.
