- 1. A copy of the regional vulnerable services work plan, and any associated updates or briefings/documents.**

The information sought in this request is to be used as part of a report by the New Zealand Herald.

This Northern Region Vulnerable Services Programme was initiated in May 2020. It includes a range of projects commissioned by Northern Region Chief Executives and Chief Medical Officers (CMOs) focusing on services that have vulnerabilities and/or longstanding challenges in sustainably delivering consistent and equitable outcomes and access for our population.

The approach includes taking services through a six step process to define the challenges, develop solutions, incorporate insights from Māori clinical leaders and Pacific clinical leaders, and confirm regional agreement on an approach to implement change.
