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Re: Official Information Act request - Data on spinocerebellar ataxia

I refer to your Official Information Act request dated 8 April 2021, and related transfer from Waitemata DHB, requesting the following information:

- Percentage of the population suffering from the medical condition spinocerebellar ataxia
 Response: 4/100,000. This figure is not from actual data collated by Auckland DHB but from a research database.
- 2. Probability of such persons requiring health services costing in excess of \$41000per annum
- 3. What is the rate of progressive deterioration of health observed in such patients over a 5 year period
- 4. Percentage of patients who become entirely dependent on health care service provider for their routine care over a 5 year period
- 5. Mortality rate of such patients- at the age of 60, 70, 80 & 90

The information related to questions 2-4 does not exist. Neither Waitemata nor Auckland DHB collect the data you are seeking. You may find guidance in the international medical literature, but it is important to understand that this is a highly individual disorder, so each particular patient has their own degree of disability, disease progression and needs.
